Our Vision

Finance Committee

This committee finalises and agrees the budget each financial year and presents a report to the Full Governing Body for approval prior to submission to the LEA. It also receives and considers at least once a term, financial reports outlining the school's income and expenditure account, to ensure the maintenance of a balanced budget, and to assist in identifying ways of balancing demands on resources with the funds available, and to report thereon to the Governing Body.

Curriculum and Standards Committee

This committee considers all matters in relation to the school curriculum. This includes the school development plan, policies relating to the curriculum, pupil's targets, and performance. Members of the committee are invited into school to take part in learning walks alongside the Leadership Team.

Premises and Health and Safety

This committee considers all matters relating to Health and Safety and the school premises including security and grounds. This involves regular inspection of the premises to identify essential maintenance.

Safeguarding and Well-Being Committee

This committee discusses the well-being of children and staff. These discussions also include attendance discussions and behaviour discussions. Additional learning needs is also discussed at these meetings.

School Environment

We have invested money this year to improve the school building and site. We have painted numerous areas within the school, laid new flooring to nursery and reception classrooms, installed new doors to 3 classrooms and the hall, installed new fire doors upstairs and installed a new roof to the key stage 2 building. We also have a new entrance and reception area. We will continue to improve the building next year.

The toilet provision for all pupils is good. The school has 5 toilet blocks for pupils (Nursery, Reception, Y1 &2, Y 3-5 and Y6). The school has disabled toilets. These are cleaned daily by the Vale Cleaners.

2022 Estyn

The school was inspected by Estyn in November 2022. The school was categorised as needing special measures.

Estyn Recommendations:

- R1 Strengthen leadership to operate more strategically
- R2 Ensure that self-evaluation and planning for improvement procedures are rigorous enough to address the areas for improvement
- R3 Provide activities that set an appropriate level of challenge so that all pupils can achieve to the best of their ability consistently
- R4 Provide stimulating learning activities that support older pupils to develop and apply their skills purposefully over time
- R5 Ensure that teachers' feedback on pupils' work is purposeful and provides regular opportunities for pupils to improve their work

To make progress against the recommendations, the school has a Post Inspection Action Plan that has been ratified by Estyn.

Estyn have visited the school twice during this academic year to monitor the progress against the recommendations. Once in October 2023 and once in March 2024. Estyn recognised that significant progress has been made.

Equal Opportunities

The school is committed to ensuring equality within the class and outside the class. The Governing Body, Headteacher, staff and pupils strongly believe in promoting the concept of equal opportunity for all individuals. All forms of prejudice and discrimination based on race, gender, belief, language, sexual orientation, disability or age are opposed. Additional Learning Needs

The Governor with responsibility for ALN for this academic year was Mrs Llinos Misra. Miss Williams was the ALNCo. The Governors receive an update regarding developments in this area at every Full Governing Body meeting as part of the Headteacher's Report. The school follows the ALN Act for children with ALN and the support given takes many forms. The ALNCo identifies pupils that need additional support, then plans and advises other members of staff what interventions are needed. Class teachers modify work for individuals/groups and staff provide suitable intervention programmes. The school also works closely with external agencies – such as the Education Psychologist and Engagement Services. Miss Williams works closely with parents and has regular meetings with parents. The staff have all received Trauma Informed Schools UK training and ALN training.

Curriculum

It is an exciting time in Welsh education, and we have designed a Curriculum based on what is important to our 'Cynefin' at Pen Y Garth. We have collaborated and decided what our pupils should learn, how they should learn and why we plan what is taught in our classes.

Our aspiration at Pen Y Garth is for everyone to realise the four purposes.

- 1. Ambitious, capable learners who are ready to learn throughout their lives.
- 2. Enterprising, creative contributors who are ready to play a full part in life and work.
- 3. Principled, informed citizens who are ready to play their part in Wales and the world
- 4. **Healthy, confident individuals** who are ready to live a full life as a valuable member of society.

The 4 purposes are an integral part of our planning process and form the basis of our new vision. Through cross-curricular themes, authentic experiences and various teaching styles, pupils are nurtured to incorporate the 4 purposes for lifelong learning.
